CARMEL, Calif. -- Mrs. Jeanette "Jeanie" Stewart, 83, of Carmel, Calif., died Sunday, May 2, 2004.

Private funeral services have been held and a memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday, May 18, at The Church of the Wayfarer, Lincoln and Seventh in Carmel.

Born Nov. 19, 1920, in Atlanta, Mrs. Stewart was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Julian Fluker. She graduated from North Avenue Presbyterian High School, known as "NAPS," a part of The Westminster Schools in Atlanta. She then attended Wesleyan College in Macon. She and her husband, Hunter Stewart, were married in Anchorage, Alaska, in 1968 and lived on Kodiak Island, Alaska, for several years before moving to Carmel, where Mr. Stewart was stationed for two tours of duty while in the U.S. Navy. While in Georgia, Mrs. Stewart was a member of the Rabun Gap Nacoochee Guild of Atlanta and the Junior Service League of Moultrie. In Carmel, she became a member of The Church of the Wayfarer, Monterey Peninsula Volunteer Services, the Symphony Guild, Carmel Foundation and other organizations.

She was preceded in death by her son, Howard "Skip" Few Jr., who died in 1995.

Survivors include her husband, Hunter Stewart; one daughter, Carol White and husband Dennis of Berkeley, Calif.; one daughter-in-law, Bonnie Few of Fort Walton Beach, Fla.; four stepdaughters, Carol Stewart Cooper and Janet Stewart Blincoe, both of Lodi, Calif., Victoria Stewart Mullins of Pine Top, Ariz., and Pamela Stewart Bily of Carmel; nine grandchildren; and one great-grandchild.
