JOHN OLSEN, AGED CITIZEN, PASSED AWAY HERE TODAY

John Olsen, 69 years of age, passed away at his home, 311 Wolf street, at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, following a short illness. Mr. Olsen suffered a stroke of paralysis on Monday and his condition had been serious since that time.

Mr. Olsen came to the United States 39 years ago, and soon after his arrival in this country he came to Brunswick, where he has since resided. He was well known among a large circle of friends in the city, especially in marine circles, with which he had been connected for years.

The deceased is survived by four children, Mrs. Olga Melson, of Brooklyn, Mrs. N.N. Gates, of Columbus, Ga., Albert Olsen of Philadelphia and Louis Olsen, of this city.

The funeral will be held from the family residence Saturday afternoon but the exact hour has not been announced. Undertaker Edo Miller will be in charge.
